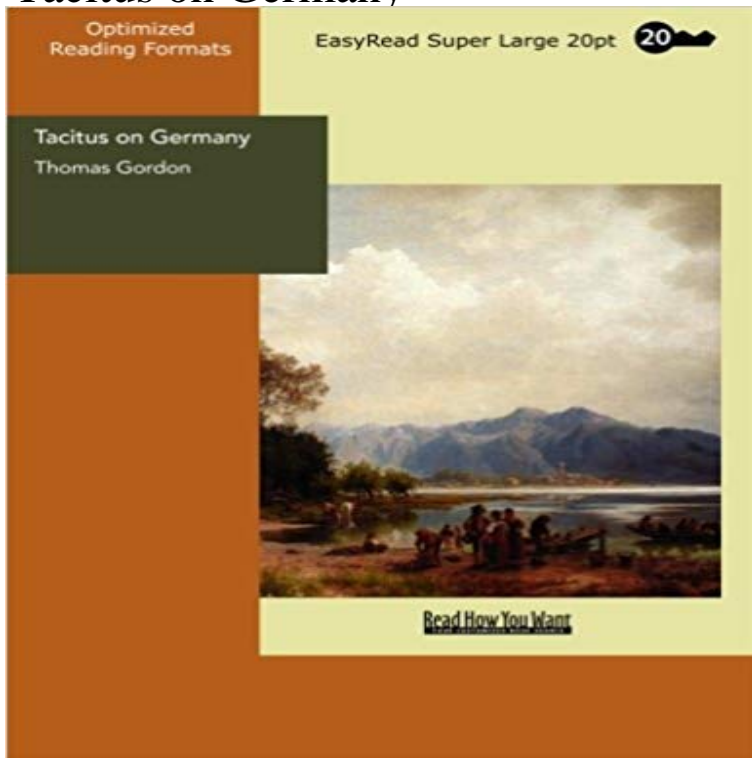


Tacitus on Germany
