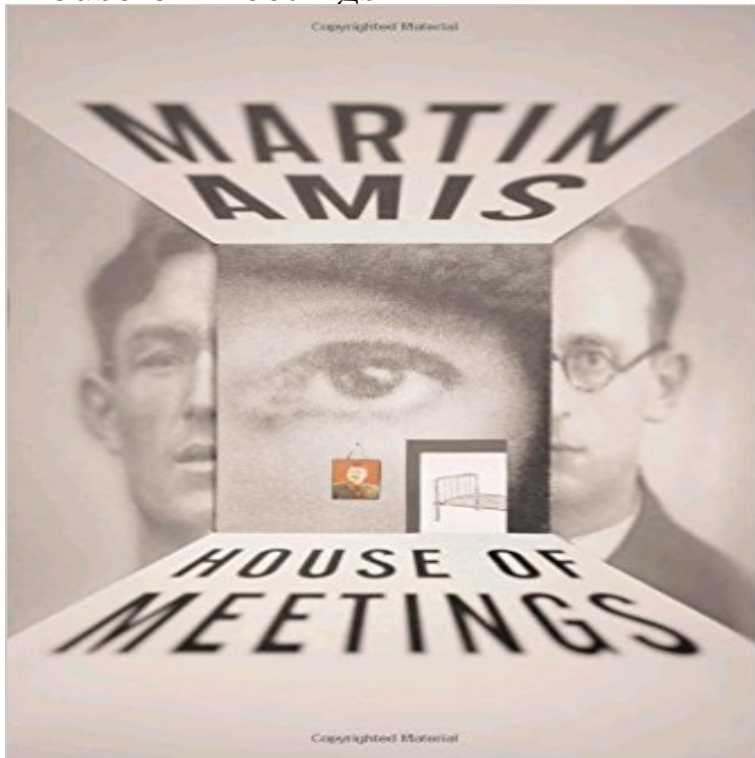


House of Meetings
